Who may witness a statutory declaration?

Please note that under section 9 of the Oaths and Declarations Act 1957, a declaration in New Zealand must be made before:

- a person enrolled as a barrister and solicitor of the High Court; or
- a Justice of the Peace; or (b)
- (c) a notary public; or
- the Registrar or a Deputy Registrar of the Supreme Court; or (ca)
- (d) the Registrar or a Deputy Registrar of the Court of Appeal; or
- (e) a Registrar or Deputy Registrar of the High Court or a District Court; or
- some other person authorised by law to administer an oath; or (f)
- a member of Parliament; or (g)
- (h) a person who is a fellow of the body (incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908) that, immediately before the commencement of the Oaths and Declarations Amendment Act 2001,
 - was called the New Zealand Institute of Legal Executives; and
 - (ii) is acting in the employment of the holder of a practising certificate as a barrister and solicitor of the High Court; or
 - an employee of the New Zealand Transport Agency, authorised for that purpose (by name, (i) or as the holder for the time being of a specified office or title) by the Minister of Justice by notice in the Gazette; or
 - an employee of Public Trust constituted under the Public Trust Act 2001, authorised for that (ia) purpose (by name, or as the holder for the time being of a specified office or title) by the Minister of Justice by notice in the Gazette; or
 - (j) an officer in the service of the Crown, or of a local authority within the meaning of the Local Government Act 2002, authorised for that purpose (by name, or as the holder for the time being of a specified office or title) by the Minister of Justice by notice in the Gazette.

Under section 11 of the Oaths and Declarations Act 1957, the following conditions apply to a declaration made outside New Zealand:

- A declaration made in a Commonwealth country other than New Zealand shall be made before a Judge, a (1)Commissioner of Oaths, a notary public, a Justice of the Peace, or any person authorised by the law of that country to administer an oath there for the purpose of a judicial proceeding, or before a Commonwealth representative, or before a solicitor of the High Court of New Zealand.
- (2) A declaration made in a country other than a Commonwealth country shall be made before a Commonwealth representative, or before a Judge, or before a notary public, or before a solicitor of the High Court of New Zealand.
